Under the direct leadership of the Vice Chairman and the Members of the Chairman –in-Council the execution of the Green City Mission work is being taken up from July 2017 and the first phase of the project is expected to be completed by 30/11/2017.

2. Activities during the month of June 2017 Health Sector

Intensive Diarrhoea Control Fortnight Programme (IDCF):

Intensive Diarrhoea Control Fortnight Programme was observed from 12/06/2017 to 24/062017.

As a part of the programme nine Mother-Child Orientation Camps were held in different Health Centres to train up the mothers to adopt preventive healthy measures for protecting their children from the menace of diarrhoeal attack.



Blood Donation Camp

A blood donation camp was organised in the Municipal office on the 29th June, 2017 in the banner of Maheshtala Municipality to encourage people to donate blood in order to prevent scarcity of blood in the hospitals/nursing homes and to ensure

regular supply of blood. 100 donors donated blood.

Shri Dulal Das, Chairnman presided over the blood donation camp in presence of the Vice Chairman, Chairman – in-Council, Smt. Kasturi Das, MLA was present as Chief Guest.



Special Outreach Health Camps

Eight Special Outreach Health Camps were organized in this month under National Urban Health Mission at ward no 1, 2, 13, 15, 26, 28,

32 and 34. Camps were organized at the community level in different schools. Special outreach camps are regular activity of the Municipality to ensure healthy life of the citizens and 100% immunization coverage of the children. Besides routine vaccination, health checkup and different services were provided by qualified doctors and nurses and medicines were distributed also. Total 351 children and community people received services from the camps.

Prevention of Dengue

To aware people about dengue fever and how to prevent it from spreading door to door survey was made in two phases by the health workers. Around than one lakh house visit was made in this month.

3. Activities under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission: WBSULM (West Bengal Urban Livelihood Mission):

 Micro savings and financial inclusions of the target groups are the most important agenda of the



Mission. As a part of it 13 new Self Help Groups had opened their group savings bank account in this month. Regular mentoring and support is provided by the Community Organizers to maintain books of accounts. 25 SHGs have received one time revolving fund of Rs. 10,000 each, so that they can start micro lending within the group.

 Ward level meetings to form new groups and also to motivate existing groups are regularly conducted. Simultaneously bank visits are undertaken to resolve different bank branches to resolve problems which are preventing regular activities of the SHGs.



• Financial Literacy of the economically underprivileged is the first step towards ensuring financial inclusion of marginalized community. As part of the Financial Literacy week declared by Reserve Bank of India a Financial Literacy camp was organized for the SHG members comprising ward no 23, 24 and 29 on the 9th June 2017 at Utpal Dutta Mancha. Managers and Senior Officers from different branches of United Bank of India and Bangiya Gramin Vikash Bank were presentd as resource person to share modalities to different schemes of government, importance of savings habit etc. Around 190 SHG members took part in the programme.
